
HOSPITAL SERVICE CUTS

On the Chopping Block:

 The plan would close fully 16% of beds at the Stratford Hospital.

The proposed cuts include 9 rehabilitation beds,
13 chronic care beds and 3 surgical beds.

For Stratford patients: more travel, longer waits, care further from home.

The proposed cuts at the Stratford Hospital are deep. Often our beds are already all full and waits for home and long-term care are already excessive. The proposed cuts would mean:

- A backlog of people waiting in the emergency department and more pressure to discharge patients quicker and sicker.
- More re-admissions and patient suffering as patients are transferred to hospital sites where beds are available – outside of their community.
- Members of families may be dispersed to different sites across the HPHA to receive health care services.
- Patients may be transferred multiple times between sites in Stratford,
 St. Marys, Clinton and Seaforth.
- There may no longer be the care you need in the town where you live.

Billions of dollars are being cut from the health care that you and your family count on.

Ontarians are paying the price for years of the deepest tax cuts in the country for corporations and the wealthiest, by curtailing health funding by \$3 billion.

That is billions in real dollar cutbacks over the last 5 years – and for years to come we don't stop them.



By every measure, most or all other provinces do better than Ontario in funding hospitals, health care and other services.
There is no reason that we can't too. It isn't about money. It's about paying for corporate tax cuts.



The service cuts proposed at the Stratford Hospital will hurt patients.

If the current plan goes ahead, Stratford's Hospital will lose 22 beds. The proposed cuts include 9 rehabilitation beds and 13 complex continuing care beds. This amounts to 16% of all hospital beds.

These cuts will have a serious impact on access to health care and will cause suffering as patients are transferred across sites of the HPHA.

The cuts would mean longer wait times for surgeries and the emergency department, fewer care staff, & more pressure for patients to be discharged from the hospital sicker and quicker.

The cuts have gone too far. The Ontario government must fund Ontario's hospitals adequately. Our local hospital should make the case to protect our services, not cut them.
