Key Takeaways:

- Justice E.M. Morgan of the Superior Court of Justice for Ontario certified class actions against 6 corporate chain operators of Long-Term Care Homes.
- The certified class actions include all residents, visitors/volunteers who contracted COVID-19 (and the family members of those who were infected) at a long-term care home operated by Chartwell, Extendicare, Responsive, Revera, Schlegel or Sienna.
 - o The class action covers the period of time from January 25, 2020 to May 5, 2023.
- Justice Morgan did not certify 2 class actions against operators of Municipal and Independently Owned Long Term Care Homes but granted permission to file new class actions against specific defendants, which the lawyers are considering on a case-by case basis.
 - o These actions can only be advanced if suitable representative plaintiffs come forward.
 - o A list of the homes is at the bottom of this handout.
- A separate class action about Long-Term Care Homes against the Ontario government is not affected by this decision.

What are the Long-Term Care Home Operators Class Actions about?

- Residents, visitors, and families of people who suffered from COVID-19 as a result of the alleged gross negligence of owners and operators Long-Term Care Homes from January 25, 2020 to May 5, 2023 brought 8 class actions against the companies and municipalities who owned and operated their long-term care homes.
- The theory of these cases overlapped. In all of them, the theory was that the vast majority of COVID-19 deaths and infections in long-term care homes could have been prevented if timely and proper infection prevention and control procedures and pandemic plans had been in place.

How far along are the Long-Term Care Home Operator's Class Actions?

• The recent court decision was to determine whether the 8 proposed class actions could be "certified" to move forward as class actions.

Certified Actions:

- Class actions were certified against the following corporate chains:
 - o Chartwell
 - Extendicare
 - o Responsive
 - o Revera
 - o Schlegel
 - o Sienna

- The court certified common issues about gross negligence, meaning that, at a future common issues trial, a court will have to answer several questions about gross negligence that apply across all Class Members.
- The court **removed** several entities from the above 6 actions.
 - These were separate companies, unrelated to the corporate chains, which owned, managed, or held the licenses for homes operated by the big corporate chains but were not considered to be a part of the larger corporation (a list of these entities is included at the bottom of this handout).

Non-Certified Actions:

- 2 of the class actions were **not** certified to proceed in the proposed class action format:
 - Municipal Homes
 - o Independently Owned Homes
- For the above 2 actions, the judge permitted the plaintiffs' lawyers to refile the lawsuits and proceed if suitable representative plaintiffs come forward.

What happens next in the actions against the Long-Term Care Home Operators?

- The **Revera and Responsive** actions will proceed as class actions:
 - The court will approve formal notices to class members which will explain their rights in greater detail.
 - o A settlement may be reached at any time in the proceedings.
- Chartwell, Extendicare, Schlegel, and Sienna filed a motion asking the court to grant "leave" (meaning permission) to appeal the certification decision.
 - o The leave to appeal motion will be decided in mid-August. It will be entirely in writing.
- Lawyers for the plaintiffs are reviewing evidence and considering filing against the smaller entities that were removed from the big 6 corporate chain actions separately, if appropriate.
- The non-certified actions against the Municipal and Independently Owned Homes will be discontinued, <u>but</u> the lawyers for the plaintiffs are reviewing the evidence in these actions and <u>are considering filing standalone actions against each defendant if suitable representative</u> plaintiffs come forward.
 - A list of the homes involved in these actions is included below anyone interested in acting as a representative plaintiff on behalf of residents, visitors or family members of visitors and residents in those homes is invited to reach out as soon as possible using the contact information below.

What is the Class Action against the Ontario Government about?

- Aside from the Long-Term Care Home Operators' Class Actions, there is a <u>separate</u> class action
 against the Province of Ontario for its role in the spread of COVID-19 in Long-Term Care Homes
 in Ontario.
- The government class action differs from those against the long-term care home operators:

- The Class includes all LTC residents and their families (no visitors) no matter which Ontario Long-Term Care home they were at.
- The Class is not limited to those who were infected with COVID-19, but it is possible that it will eventually be narrowed to just those individuals.
- The class action against the government was certified in December 2022 and then upheld by the Court of Appeal in February 2024.
 - Ontario is currently seeking leave to appeal to the Supreme Court of Canada, and the leave application should be determined in the next several months.
