Ontario Health Coalition COVID-19 Outbreaks in Non-Healthcare Settings Updated to: October 13 2020 Released on October 20, 2020

Introduction

As wave two has now officially hit Ontario, we have tracked devastating increases in workplace infections outside of the health care industry. Our tracking report which includes the spread of COVID-19 inside the health care industry will be released in a separate report shortly. We have found that there has been a 38.63% increase in cases associated with workplace outbreaks in the last three weeks with 4,149 on September 22 and 5,756 as of October 13. This is troubling considering that the rate of increase in the general public during the same time was 26.56% with 47,084 cases as of September 22 and 59,522 as of October 13.¹ Public Health Ontario has also reported a 68% increase in active outbreaks in what we consider to be workplace settings in the last three weeks with 162 active outbreaks during the week of September 22² increasing to 272 active outbreaks during the week of October 10.³ This amounts to a 38.56% increase to the cumulative outbreaks in non-health care workplaces since the beginning of the pandemic. This increase is disconcerting as we have yet to see any kind of coherent plan or regulations from the Ford Government and the few directives and regulations released have been arbitrary, lacking in detailed instructions for workplace safety procedures and implemented in an ad hoc manner.

The largest increase in cases, predictably, are in schools and day care centres. COVID-19 cases among students and school staff have increased 335.7% since our last report on September 22. This increase, compared to the 26.56% increase in the general public, is a cause for concern. Even with the different definition of "outbreak" in schools (i.e. needing a known epi-link between cases) there have been 18 outbreaks in the last week and 35 ongoing outbreaks in schools as of October 13. The Ontario reporting website does not include cases in private schools, some faith-based schools, university residences and administrative offices, but we have been able to capture a partial picture of the increase among schools in total through researching media reports. From our research we found 312 cases in schools and daycares as of September 19 and that number has risen to 1,365 as of October 13. To put the numbers in context, on October 16, the partial list (public schools) of data on the public reporting website for Ontario shows 98 cases in schools⁴, which made up almost 14% percent of the 712 cases⁵ on that day.

The retail industry has also experienced a huge increase in cases. We have been able to find information for 364 cases linked to outbreaks in restaurants, bars and retail shops. This accounts for a 47.95% increase since September 22. Most of these outbreaks are only a few cases. However there have been large and ongoing outbreaks in grocery distribution centres and Spin Co. Gym in Hamilton, which resulted in 51 cases of COVID-19.⁶

In our report we have found that industries that were hit extremely hard during the first wave and received a lot of pressure and media coverage have seen a smaller increase in cases compared to industries that flew under the radar during the first wave. For example, in homeless shelters we were only able to track a 1.5% increase in cumulative cases during this three-week period and in the agriculture sector we only found a 1.47% increase during this period. However, the case numbers in these industries may also be severely underreported as there is limited access to testing for agricultural migrant workers and the employers may be actively preventing their migrant workers from getting tested, according to reports from our members who are in communication with migrant workers. If we compare this to industries which did not receive a lot of coverage during the first wave, we can see that they have experienced a much higher rate of increase. Public Services, which includes public transportation and the LCBO, have experienced a 52.49% increase in cumulative cases, Social Services cumulative cases have increased by 17% and Developmental Services have shown a 2.7% increase. There has also been a large outbreak in an undisclosed manufacturing plant in Peel Region with 60 cases linked to the outbreak. Public Health has refused to disclose the business information for this outbreak despite repeated calls for transparency from municipal politicians.⁷

As the second wave continues to expand from the major cities (Toronto, Ottawa, Peel), it is more important than ever that the Ford Government creates a comprehensive plan and regulation to combat this virus. If schools are going to be allowed to remain open while making up a large portion of our cases with an unknown potential for further spread, then the government must work with Public Health and provide funding in order to properly contact trace, reduce class sizes, and improve safety. For retail, public services and manufacturing businesses, owners and manager need better and clear regulations for safety procedures and these must be enforced.

We reiterate from previous reports going back to June that the government must also improve the tracking of workplace outbreaks. This is vital to understand where and how the virus is spreading so that government and public health authorities can issue policy that can more effectively ensure safety and stem the spread of COVID-19. Currently, school outbreaks are defined in a way that requires an epi-link of two or more cases to meet the threshold, yet students are sharing bathrooms, school buses, recess space etc. Many schools are excluded from the tracking. This is indefensible. Workplace outbreaks are poorly reported and are not broken down by industry in a way that is transparent. Since the approach to managing the pandemic is to keep everything possible open, rather than shutting down, it is more vital than ever that the public understands where and how COVID-19 is spreading. Currently this is not happening. Shielding business names with outbreaks is not serving the public interest. The failure to create a coherent plan and adopt policy measures by type of setting and

industry has contributed and continues to contribute significantly to the spread of COVID-19 as measured by the percentage of cases that are associated with workplace outbreaks.

This total includes cases that we had previously tracked plus all of the cases that the province is reporting since September. We have also included outbreaks in faith schools, administrative offices, student residences and private schools in our total.

Agriculture

Deaths of Three Migrant Workers:

1. On May 30, Bonifacio Eugenio-Romero, a 31-year old migrant worker from central Mexico, became the first foreign agricultural worker to die in Ontario from COVID-19. Eugenio-Romero had been in the country since early April and worked for Woodside Greenhouses Inc. in Kingsville, Ontario.

2. On June 5, a second worker, 24-year-old Rogelio Muñoz Santos, who also worked on a farm in Windsor-Essex died from COVID-19.

3. Fifty-five-year-old Juan Chaparro had been coming to Canada to work since 2010 and was employed at Norfolk County's Scotlynn Group farm, where there has been a cluster outbreak of COVID-19. He is the third migrant worker to die this month after contracting COVID-19. The two others died in the Windsor area.⁹

London/St Thomas:

London-Ontario Plants Propagation facility: May 29 2020

Eight migrant workers at the Ontario Plants Propagation facility outside of St. Thomas have tested positive for COVID-19. The workers live in London but travel to the operation at 38024 John Wise Line.¹⁰

London-Ontario Plants Propagation facility: July 8 2020

Twenty migrant workers at the Ontario Plants Propagation facility outside of St. Thomas have tested positive for COVID-19. Two agriculture workers have also tested positive for COVID-19. The workers live in London but travel to the operation at 38024 John Wise Line.¹¹

Haldimand Norfolk:

Haldimand Norfolk-Scotlynn Group: June 25 2020

Approximately 220 migrant farm workers live in residences on the farm. Approximately 200 people have tested positive. Two workers are currently hospitalized.¹²

Windsor Essex and Niagara:

June 9 2020

It is estimated that there have been 400 agriculture and food workers who have tested positive in the Windsor, Essex, and Niagara region. There have also been two Mexican migrant workers who have passed away from COVID-19 and 2 more who are currently in Intensive Care. The Windsor Essex Public Health Unit reported 43 new cases on June 9th 2020, which was the highest spike since the disease peaked in mid-April. There have also been 34 more COVID-19 cases in the town of Learnington which hosts over 8,000 migrant workers, who live in communal housing and work together closely without proper access to PPE. There have been 17 farms with COVID-19 outbreaks, but the Public Health Units are not releasing their names. The worst outbreaks have been at Greenhill Produce in Kentbridge, Scotlynn Group in Norfolk County and Ontario Plants Propagation of St Thomas.¹³

Niagara:

Pioneer Flower Farms: June 4 2020

St. Catharines greenhouse, Pioneer Flower Farms, has become the site of the single largest jump in local COVID-19 cases since the pandemic hit Niagara in March. 60 workers have been placed in isolation of which 40 have tested positive.¹⁴

Pioneer Flower Farms: July 10 2020

Pioneer Flower Farms had at least 65 workers test positive for COVID-19, increasing by 5 since the early reports of the outbreak in June. $^{\rm 15}$

The health unit says a total of 674 agri-farm workers have tested positive for the virus in the region. Six workplaces in the agriculture sector are in outbreak status – four in Leamington and two In Kingsville. ¹⁶ Naturefresh in Leamington has had 191 cases of COVID-19 in their agriculture migrant workforce over this weekend. ¹⁷

July 14 2020

The health unit says a total of 824 agri-farm workers have tested positive for the virus in the region (an increase of 150 since June 29). 18

Leamington & Kingsville Agricultural Facilities: July 7 2020

The COVID-19 outbreaks at two agricultural facilities in Leamington and two agricultural facilities in Kingsville continue.¹⁹

August 25 2020

The health unit says a total of 1170 agri-farm workers have tested positive for the virus in the region (an increase of 346 since July 14). There are currently two active outbreaks in agriculture facilities in Learnington ²⁰

September 17 2020

The health unit says a total of 1176 agri-farm workers have tested positive for the virus in the region (an increase of 6 since August 25). There no outbreaks reported in Windsor Essex ²¹

October 15 2020

The health unit says a total of 1200 agri-farm workers have tested positive for the virus in the region (an increase of 24 since September 17). There is one farm with an active outbreak in the region with 17 reported cases involved in the outbreak.^{22 23}

Chatham Kent

Greenhill Produce: June 15 2020

An outbreak was investigated at the end of April with 40 agricultural workers testing positive for COVID-19 at Greenhill Produce.²⁴

Greenhill Produce: July 2 2020

The outbreak at Greenhill Produce has grown to 103 cases in their workers but has now been resolved. $^{\rm 25}$

Chatham-Kent Agricultural Industry: August 25 2020

The Chatham-Kent Public Health Unit has reported 108 Temporary Foreign Workers and 130 Farm Workers have tested positive for COVID-19 $^{\ 26}$

Chatham-Kent Agricultural Industry: September 17 2020

The Chatham-Kent Public Health Unit has reported 112 Temporary Foreign Workers and 129 Farm Workers have tested positive for COVID-19 $\,^{27}$

Chatham-Kent Agricultural Industry: October 15 2020

The Chatham-Kent Public Health Unit has reported 111 Temporary Foreign Workers and 133 Farm Workers have tested positive for COVID-19 $^{\ 28}$

Simcoe-Muskoka:

Two Unidentified Farms: June 17 2020

Two outbreaks have been declared in Simcoe County with one farm having 9 cases in their workers and the other farm having 3 workers test positive for COVID-19. ²⁹

Vaughan:

Ravine Mushroom Farm: July 6 2020

There have been 30 confirmed cases of COVID-19 among agricultural workers at the Ravine Mushroom Farm in Vaughan. $^{\rm 30}$

Food Processing

Brampton:

Maple Lodge Farms: May 7 2020

Maple Lodge Farms in Brampton have had 25 workers test positive for COVID-19 and one worker has passed away from the virus. Maple Lodge Farms is being criticized for failing to report their first positive case for over three weeks. ³¹ As of June 8 2020 ,Maple Lodge Farms has reported that they have not had a new case of COVID-19 in their facilities for three weeks. ³²

Kitchener:

Conestoga Meat: May 22 2020

Conestoga Meat in Kitchener had to close production for a time in order to contain their COVID-19 outbreak. To date they have had 91 workers at their Breslau plant test positive for COVID-19, however 71 of those cases are now resolved.³³

York Region:

Saputo Dairy Products: May 19 2020

As of May 19 2020, there had been 50 cases of COVID-19 from workplace exposures in York Region. The largest being an outbreak at Saputo Dairy Products where 24 workers tested positive for COVID-19 and one worker passed away from the virus. The other locations have not been disclosed by the public health unit. There have been 31 workers test positive in Vaughan with one worker ending up in the ICU, 9 workers test positive in Markham with two workers hospitalized and one in the ICU, 3 workers test positive in Newmarket with one death and two currently self-isolating, 3 workers test positive in Richmond Hill with one ending up in the ICU, 2 testing positive in Aurora and 2 in Whitchurch-Stouffville.³⁴

Waterloo:

Food Processing Plant: June 2 2020

An outbreak is ongoing at a food processing plant in Waterloo with 14 workers testing positive for COVID-19. Waterloo Public Health has not released any more information about the facility. 35

Food Processing Plant: July 14 2020

Two undisclosed outbreaks in Waterloo have been declared resolved with a total of 112 cases. $^{\rm 36}$

Burford- Ferrero Plant: July 14 2020

One staff member at the Ferrero Plant has tested positive for COVID-19.³⁷

Two outbreaks occurred in FGF Bakery in Toronto resulting in 184 employees testing positive for COVID-19 and one staff member dying from the virus, the outbreaks have now been declared resolved and details have only recently been released to the public.³⁸

Social Services

Toronto:

Willowdale Welcome Centre: May 24 2020

Willowdale Welcome Centre is a Refugee Support Centre in Toronto which housed roughly 200 refugees seeking a better life in Canada. To date over 24 workers at Willowdale Welcome Centre have tested positive for COVID-19 and 180 clients at the welcome centre have also tested positive.³⁹

Ottawa:

Association Pour L'Integration Sociale D'Ottawa: May 4 2020

Ottawa Public Health reported that Association Pour L'Integration Sociale D'Ottawa, a non-profit institution, declared an outbreak on April 24 and has 1 case in a staff member. The outbreak has now been resolved⁴⁰

Association Pour L'Integration Sociale D'Ottawa: October 15 2020

Ottawa Public Health has report that the non-profit group has had outbreaks in 6 different locations starting in September with a total of 31 cases (10 residents and 21 staff members have tested positive for the virus)⁴¹

Innovative Community Services: October 15 2020

An outbreak was declared Innovative Community Services with one staff member testing positive for COVID-19.⁴²

York:

Loft Community Services: October 14 2020

There have been three confirmed cases at Loft Community Services in York. The outbreak remains open.⁴³

Homeless Shelters: June 12 2020

The Toronto Public Health unit has reported a total of 601 cases of COVID-19 in homeless shelters and respite centres. There have also been 3 deaths reported from these outbreaks with another death being reported as someone who was not a resident but visited services at a home with an outbreak. ⁴⁴ The following homes have current outbreaks.

- Birkdale/Costi Hotel Program- 25 residents have tested positive
- Fred Victor Respite- 2 residents have tested positive
- Homes First Society- 30 residents have tested positive
- Mary's Home Emergency Shelter- 6 residents have tested positive
- Maxwell Meihen Centre- 48 residents have tested positive and one is currently hospitalized
- Robertson House- 10 residents have tested positive
- Warden Woods Community- 4 residents have tested positive⁴⁵

Homeless Shelters: July 13, 2020

The Toronto Public Health unit has reported a total of 628 cases of COVID-19 in homeless shelters and respite centres, an increase of 27 cases. There have been new outbreaks declared at Seaton House and Scott Mission which had previously been cleared of outbreaks. St. Felix is also currently under an outbreak with an undisclosed amount of cases. ⁴⁶

Homeless Shelters: August 24, 2020

The Toronto Public Health unit has reported a total of 635 cases of COVID-19 in homeless shelters and respite centres an increase of 7 cases. There are currently no active outbreaks reported in Toronto. $^{\rm 47}$

Homeless Shelters: September 17 2020

The Toronto Public Health unit has reported a total of 644 cases of COVID-19 in homeless shelters and respite centres an increase of 9 cases. There is currently an outbreak at COSTI-R with 8 cases of COVID-19 and one hospitalization. 48
